INTRODUCTION

The Centre for International Education (CIE) was established in 2009 at the University of Ilorin, following a mandate from the University Senate, the institution's governing body, on June 19, 2009. The CIE's creation marked a significant step in the University's commitment to enhancing its global presence and fostering international academic collaboration.

The CIE is responsible for driving the University's internationalization efforts. This includes developing academic linkages and partnerships with international universities and research institutions to expand the University's research capabilities and academic offerings. By building these global connections, the CIE helps to strengthen the University's reputation on an international scale.

A key focus of the CIE is increasing the enrolment of international students, thereby fostering a diverse and inclusive campus environment that enhances cross-cultural understanding. The Centre also facilitates exchange programs that enable University of Ilorin students and staff to study, teach, or conduct research abroad while welcoming international students and faculty to contribute to the academic environment at the University of Ilorin.

Additionally, the CIE actively engages distinguished international faculty members to teach and conduct research at the University. This engagement brings new perspectives and expertise to the academic community, enriching the intellectual experience for both students and staff.

Since its establishment, the CIE has played a crucial role in expanding the University's global reach, fostering international cooperation, and enhancing the academic environment through its various initiatives. As the central hub for the University's internationalization strategy, the CIE aligns these efforts with the institution's broader mission and goals, promoting a vibrant, globally aware academic community.

Several distinguished individuals have served as directors of the Centre since its inception, each contributing to its growth and success. Their leadership has been instrumental in advancing the Centre's mission and strategic objectives, reinforcing the University of Ilorin's position as a globally connected institution committed to excellence in education, research, and community engagement. In addition to Prof E.A. Obeng, The former Vice Chancellor of Cape Coast University, who started the operation of the Centre, the distinguished personalities who led the Centre are:

The activities of the Centre during the 2023/2024 Academic session are as summarised below:

1. Linkages and Collaborations

During the period under review, the Centre for International Education (CIE) actively promoted academic partnerships by enhancing existing collaborations with several institutions worldwide. The University has signed 71 MoUs with Universities and Higher Institutions of learning across the globe. Specifically, 53 active Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) were selected, and efforts were concentrated on prioritizing activities related to these agreements. To effectively manage and advance these MoUs, the Desk Officers Forum was revitalised and its operations were more closely monitored. To further support this initiative, the CIE organized a two-day workshop aimed at better equipping Desk Officers with the skills and knowledge needed to maximize the benefits of these MoUs for both staff and students of the University (Table I).

2. Staff and Students Exchange

The internationalization strategy of the University has enabled staff and students exchange with Institutions abroad within the period under review.

a. Staff Exchange

The exchange of international staff continues to be one of the cardinal activities of CIE. It is well facilitated by the University administration. Currently, in addition to the four foreign staff drawn from different countries in the employment of the University, foreign faculties had opportunity to visit our university to strengthen our teaching and research capabilities One of

the international academics who contributed immensely to this respect during the period under review was Prof. Ramar Krishnamurthy from Uka Tarsadia University, India. Who frequently visit the university for teaching and research mostly in agricultural product. Presently he is collaborating with the university to grow a brand of rice that doesn't need to be in a water to survive. The rice is expected to be produced in commercial quantity very soon. He has facilitated numbers of Unilorin staff to visit India for teaching, research, mobility and completing their Ph.D programmes. Through his efforts, Drs. Adetitun David and Oyedeji Stephen are currently in Uka Tarsadia University, India on staff exchange. Prof. Margherita Salvadori of Torino Univeristy also visit the Faculty of Law on a staff exchange programme. Dr. Jony Hon Shin from the Ohio State University also visit the Department of Agricultural Economics and Farm Management, University of Ilorin, Ilorin, Nigeria, for a two-week on research visit in connection with a grant from the Feed the Future Advancing Local Leadership & Innovation Networks (ALL-IN) initiative.

From the Faculty Law, Professor A.C. Onuora-Oguno and Dr. H.B. Ojibara visited the University of Torino 2023 on Staff Exchange. Also from the Faculty of Life Sciences, two academic staff are on Leave of Absence outside Nigeria (Malaysia and Gambia) and one from the Faculty of Education, Prof Abdulrazaq Oniye is a dean of Faculty in Ruwanda.

Dr. Oluwabunmi Lucy Niyi-Gafar, the immediate past CIE Deputy Director from the Faculty of Law had the opportunity to undertake a working visit in Lithuania on an Erasmus+ KA171 Mobility/Teaching Scholarship, at Mykolas Romeris University, Lithuania between 6th and 10th May, 2024.

b. Fulbright Scholar visitation

This is one activity that has helped in bringing researchers and scholars in and out of the University for the purpose of research and teaching. During the period under review, Prof. Aribidesi A. Usman of Arizona State University, USA, a Fulbright Scholar arrived on 30th November, 2023 for an academic year in the University. Prof. Aribidesi is currently in the Department of History and International Studies, Faculty of Arts and Humanities, assisting in co-development of Curriculum for the take-off of B.A. and M.A. degrees in Anthropology. He is also engaging in research collaborations with lecturers in History and International Studies Department and mentoring graduate students through teaching workshops and seminars.

c. Staff Mobility and Postdoctoral Fellowship

- From the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Science, Dr Attah Francis Alfred Unuagbe traveled to Austria for three months under a research corporation agreement between Medical University of Vienna and University of Ilorin funded by government of Austria.

- From Faculty of Clinical Sciences, an Exchange programme at the Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Centre, Manhattan, USA for 3 months (November 2023 to March 2024) granted Dr. M.O. Bojuwoye under the Mammadi Soudavar Fellowship programme.
- From the Faculty of Physical Sciences, BAKER, M. T. won a 3 month Bench work for PhD research in India. Also, a Postdoctoral Fellowship in the Africa Health Research Institute, South Africa won by Dr. A. W. Banjoko of the Department of Statistics. A TetFund Postdoctoral Fellowship Award tenable at the Hydro & Electrometallurgy Department, Institute of Minerals and Materials technology, Bhubaneswar, India was won by Dr. I. Ayinla of the Department of Industrial Chemistry. Another Postdoctoral Fellowship at the Institute of Environmental Radioactivity, Fukushima University, Japan was won by M. M. Orosun of the Department of Physics. In addition, a Postdoctoral Fellowship of the Central University of Technology, Free State, South Africa was won by K. O. Ibrahim of the Department of Geology.
- Prof. R. O. Babatunde of the Department of Agricultural Economics & Farm Management won a Visiting Research Fellowship of the Research Institute for Humanity and Nature (RIHN), Kyoto, Japan for 3 months between 07th July, 2024 and 01st October, 2024.
- A non-teaching staff of Centre for International Education, Mrs. Arinola Saadat Gambari was also given the opportunity to visit Lithuania on an Erasmus+ KA171 Staff Mobility for training during the 12th International Staff Exchange Week at Mykolas Romeris University between 17th and 21st June, 2024.

d. Staff Training

Two staff of academic staff attended the International Hands-on Training on CRISPR/Cas-mediated Genome Editing which was organized by the Center for Advanced Studies in Agriculture and food security (CAS-AFS), D-8 Research Center for Agriculture and food security (D-8 RCAF), National Center for Genome Editing (NCGE) and Center of Agricultural Biochemistry and Biotechnology (CABB), University of Agriculture, Faisalabad, Pakistan. They are Dr Bankole Folusho from the Department of Agronomy, Faculty of Agriculture. Her specialization is Plant Breeding and Genetics and Dr Khadijat Abdulhamid Abdulkareem from the Department of Plant Biology, Faculty of Life Sciences. Her specialization is Cytogenetics/Molecular Biology.

Two other staff of the University who are currently on training on Stem Cell research in Wisconsin University, USA. The training which was scheduled to last for 18 months took effective from 15th of October, 2022 and expected to end on the 30th of June, 2024 and may be

extended by mutual agreement of the parties. They are: Dr. David Animashaun and Dr. Saheed Afolabi

e. Research Collaboration

During the period of this report, the University collaborates with international research organizations and institutions, including the African Research Group for Oncology, the Prostate Cancer Clinical Trial Consortium, and the NIHR Global Health Research Unit on Global Surgery, among others. Prof. Musa Olawale from the Faculty of Life Sciences received a grant in 2023 from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in the United States. The grant supports a multi-year project focused on developing innovative diagnostic tools and treatment methods for malaria. Dr. Aisha Ahmed, a senior lecturer in the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences, was awarded a research grant in 2024 by the World Health Organization (WHO) to study the impact of traditional medicines in managing non-communicable diseases in rural communities. This grant supports comprehensive field research to improve public health outcomes. Dr. Samuel Akintola from the Faculty of Engineering and Technology secured a fellowship grant in 2023 from the Alexander von Humboldt Foundation in Germany. The grant supports his research in renewable energy systems, specifically focusing on developing efficient solar energy technologies suitable for the African climate. Prof. Olufunke Adeyemi, a researcher in the Faculty of Education, received funding in 2023 from the British Council under the Newton Fund. She leads a collaborative project on innovative teaching methodologies in STEM education, aiming to improve STEM learning outcomes among secondary school students in Nigeria. Dr. Michael Nwosu from the Faculty of Social Sciences won a research grant in 2024 from the African Research Consortium to conduct a study on the socioeconomic impacts of migration in West Africa. This research will provide insights into policy-making and sustainable development strategies in the region.

The Faculty of Clinical Sciences actively engages in global collaborations to advance research and development in clinical sciences. Among these partnerships is the African Research Group for Oncology (ARGO), where Professors S.A. Olatoke and S.O. Agodirin lead research efforts on gastrointestinal cancer, establishing one of the largest international collaborations in this field.

Additionally, Professor Ademola Popoola serves as the Nigerian Principal Investigator (PI) for the Prostate Cancer Clinical Trial Consortium (PCCTC) and the International Registry of Men with Advanced Prostate Cancer (IRONMAN), focusing on advanced prostate cancer research. The faculty is also involved with the NIHR Global Health Research Unit on Global Surgery, where Professor L.O.

Abdurrahman is the Deputy Director in Nigeria, overseeing multiple projects that have produced numerous high-quality publications.

Professor Ademola Popoola also collaborates with Dr. Colon-Otero of the Mayo Clinic in Florida through the iCCaRE for Black Men Consortium, working on Vitamin D interventions for advanced prostate cancer. This project is set to expand to additional Nigerian institutions following a pilot phase at the University of Ilorin.

Dr. G.H. Ibraheem leads the Ponseti Clubfoot Treatment initiative at the Ilorin site, focusing on the management of clubfoot deformities in children. Meanwhile, Prof. A.A. Nasir heads the Smile Train initiative at the University Teaching Hospital, providing treatment for cleft lip and palate deformities.

The Stroke and Cardiovascular Research Training (S-CaRT) program, funded by the Fogarty International Centre of the NIH, offers a unique training opportunity for early-career academics from Nigeria and Ghana, led by Prof. B.S. Alabi and a distinguished team of mentors. Lastly, the faculty is collaborating with the University of Wisconsin, Michigan, on research in ocular genetics and retinoblastoma, further expanding its global research footprint.

f. Student Exchange

During the period covered by this report, one doctoral student from the Department of Linguistics and Nigerian Languages, Adeyemi Roheemat Olabimpe, was in Lithuania on an Erasmus+ KA171 Scholarship for Research Training under the Faculty of Humanities and Social Studies at Mykolas Romeris University, Vilnius, from May 6th to July 25th, 2024.

Other students who benefitted from exchange programs include Mr. A. L. Olarewaju, Mr. O.W. Wahab, and Mr. K. A. Osunkunle, who visited the University of Torino, Italy, in 2023 on a student exchange program. Additionally, Babalola David visited Morrision Hospital in Wales from January 11th to January 19th, 2024, on a student exchange program. Two students from the Faculty of Physical Sciences, Raji Mustapha Adekunle and Balogun Ayo Felix, embarked on Ph.D. bench work in India.

3. International Students' Enrolment

Over the years, the Centre for International Education (CIE) at the University of Ilorin has seen a steady increase in the enrollment of international students. Currently, the university hosts two hundred and fifty (250) foreign students from fifteen (15) different countries across its Language Immersion, undergraduate,

and postgraduate programs. This year alone, 123 international applicants were recommended for admission; of these, 120 were admitted into various courses of study, while 3 were not qualified. Out of the 120 admitted applicants, 66 acknowledged, accepted, and registered for their respective courses.

The University of Ilorin was recognised by the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) as the Nigerian university with the highest number of international student enrollments for the 2022/2023 academic session. All foreign students are members of the University of Ilorin International Students Association (UISA), where they continue to enjoy a vibrant university life through active participation in the socio-cultural activities of the Association.

4. CIE Working Visits to Faculties

The Centre visited all faculties of the University to sensitize the staff on CIE activities and services for the benefits of the University Community including research grants opportunities, staff and student's mobility and the procedure for accessing TETFund conference grant. During the visit, CIE highlighted the guidelines for accessing the fund and encouraged both teaching and non-teaching staff to take advantage of the fund to participate in international conferences. In addition, CIE encouraged the nomination of faculty representatives and creation of faculty internationalization committee to facilitate smooth communication between the Centre and Faculties of the University.

5. CIE Working Visits to Embassies in Abuja

The Centre visited selected Embassies of West African sub-regions, East Africa, Middle East and Europe in the Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Abuja for the purpose of establishing relationship with these Embassies to facilitate the following activities in their respective countries:

- a- Collaboration of Unilorin with Universities and Research Institutions in their countries.
- b- Facilitating Recruitment of international students from their countries.
- c- Invitations of the Embassies to participate at the annual international students' day at the University.
- d- Invitation of the Ambassadors or the President of their countries for Public or Convocation Lectures.
- e- Partnership on building hostel for students in the University based on a policy of Build, Operate and Transfer (B.O.T.)

The visits yielded positively as some Embassies have shown interest in the activities and discussions are still ongoing between CIE and these Embassies. For instance, through this initiative, the University now has collaboration with Al-Akhwain University, Morocco, Our Earth Organization and ABC Organization in America, etc.

6. Conferences

- a. During the period under review, the University, through the facilitation of the Centre, attracted a total of One Hundred and Eighty Two Million, Eight Hundred and Seventy Seven Thousand, Eight Hundred and Thirty Eight Naira only (₦182,877,838.00) in TETFund grants to sponsor 40 academic staff members to attend international conferences in various parts of the world (Table II). An additional Sixteen Million, Five Hundred and Fifty-Two Thousand, Nine Hundred and Fifty-Two Naira, Fifteen Kobo (₦16,552,952.15) is currently being processed for a second batch of academic staff to attend international conferences. Furthermore, another Seventy-One Million, Nine Hundred and Eighty-Eight Thousand, Four Hundred and Ninety-Seven Naira, Twenty-One Kobo (₦71,988,497.21) is being processed with TETFund in Abuja to sponsor non-teaching staff of the University to attend local conferences. University Sponsored International Conferences

The University administration graciously sponsored a 15-member delegation to participate in the 9th Association of West Africa Universities (AWAU) international annual conference held between 20th and 24th February, 2024 at the Cape Coast University in Ghana, covering all expenses including registration fees, transportation and accommodation. In addition, the administration has also paid the registration fees for the conference of 38 members of staff whose abstracts were accepted for virtual presentation.

Similarly, at the time of writing this report, the University is also sponsoring academic staff, physically and virtually, to U6+ Consortium conference holding in Cape Peninsula University of Technology (CPUT), South Africa from 10 to 12 September, 2024.

b. Joint Conference

As part of the collaboration with University of Georgia, Antens, USA, an International conference was jointly organize by the University of Ilorin and University of Georgia where the Vice-Chancellor Prof. Wahab Egbewole delivered a Commissioned paper. He was represented by Prof. Rotimi Williams Omotoye, the Desk Officer. The latter also presented a paper at the Conference.

c. U6+ Conference

The Eight U6+ Conference was held at Cape Peninsula University of Technology, Cape town, South Africa between 10th and 12th September, 2024. The delegates from the University of Ilorin were ably led by the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Wahab Olasupo Egbewole, SAN together with fourteen physical and thirteen virtual participants. All delegates presented quality papers and initiated positive collaborations and networking. All fees (registration, accommodation, flight and

sustenance) were fully covered by the University of Ilorin administration and certificates of attendance and participation were issued to all participants.

d. JVI-Unilorin

The University of Ilorin in collaboration with Robert Gordon University Scotland organized a virtual mini conference held on 25th September, 2024. The conference was a Cross Cultural Conversation among academia and professionals in Law discipline. The conference was graced by legal luminaries such as Hon. Justice Helen Morenikaji Ogunwumiju of the Supreme Court of Nigeria and a Professor of Practice, Lawyer Olaolu Ali, SAN of the Ghlib Chamber, Ilorin and others.

7. CIE International Staff Welfare

In August 2023, a courtesy visit was made to each international staff member of the University to introduce them to the new management and staff of the Centre. This initiative allowed the Centre to understand their needs better and to enhance their comfort and productivity during their stay at the University. The visits also reassured the international staff of the University Administration's commitment to addressing their welfare, including immigration matters, health, and security concerns. Consequently, Dr Jean Maric Kasonga Mbombo and his family were sponsored to travel back to their home country for a visit.

To foster a sense of belonging and community, international students and staff were invited to dinners during the Christmas, Ramadan, and Eid al-Adha festivals, helping them feel at home away from home. Additionally, the University provided a 50% subsidy on tuition fees for newly admitted international students.

Events

a. Orientation/Interactive session

An interactive Orientation programme was organised for both the fresh and returning international students for the 2022/2023 Academic Session to educate them on the University rules and regulations, life and living in Nigeria, maintaining academic focus, health, immigration and personal development issues. Resource people were drawn from relevant units of the University and beyond to add value to the programme.

b. X-Culture Certificate Presentation

X-Culture is an international organization that offers students enrolled in International Business and International Management courses at universities worldwide the opportunity to experience the challenges of international collaboration and learn best practices. Over about eight weeks, students work in international teams of 5-7 to develop a business proposal for a real

international company, culminating in a report that outlines the economic feasibility of their idea and provides guidelines for its implementation.

In the 2024-1B session of the program, 121 students from the University of Ilorin enrolled. Of these, 51 students took the readiness test, but only 41 advanced to the grouping stage and actively participated in the program. Upon completing the program, these students received certificates of participation, which were presented by the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ilorin at a ceremony in the University auditorium. Having completed the program, these students have now become international business consultants in their own right.

International Students' Day

The 11th International Students Day was celebrated on June 13th, 2024, with the goal of bringing together a diverse array of cultures and showcasing the rich diversity among the student body. The event provided an opportunity to reflect on the importance of internationalization in university education and its role in enhancing academic excellence. A highlight of the program was a lecture titled "Internationalization in Tertiary Institutions and Peaceful Co-existence in Africa," delivered by Prof. Olugbenga A. Mokuolu, the former Director of the University Medical Screening Centre at the University of Ilorin. The event also offered students the chance to showcase their unique cultures through drama, dance, and cuisine. International students added vibrancy to the celebration by displaying their national flags. Additionally, the University anthem was translated from English into French and received official approval for use by the University administration.

8. International Visitors

During the period, the CIE received the following international visitors:

- d. Prof. Alfred P. Vogiel from Department of Life Sciences, Imperial College and Natural History Museum London, visited the University as a visiting research fellow to the Department of Zoology, Faculty of Life Sciences between 3 and 13 June, 2024. He was accompanied by an Alumnus of the University, Mrs Hajarat, who is his Ph.D. student,
- e. His Excellency Mohsen Antit, The Ambassador of the Republic of Tunisia to the Federal Republic of Nigeria visited Unilorin on the 2nd of July 2024 to attend the symposium and

unveiling of festschrift in honour of prof J.K.Olorunfemi organised by the Department of Geography and Environmental Management

9. University Profile – Enhancing Initiatives

In order to enhance the University's profile, in conformity with the University's Strategic Plan and in observance of global best practices, the CIE engaged in a number of initiatives during the period under review:

a. **Online Presence:** The Centre ensured adequate publicity and proper documentation of its events and activities online and in the University Bulletin. Efforts were made to revive the CIE's web domain on the university's website.
